Huron County Public Health COVID-19 Weekly Update

February 7, 2022

Report Summary

This report covers Huron County's COVID-19 update for the reporting period of 1/28/2022 -2/3/2022 but is delayed being released due to inclement weather-related closings on 2/3/22 and 2/4/22. The reporting period (1/28/2022-2/3/2022) has recorded a case count of 172 cases, which is a significant decrease from 341 for the previous reporting period. The average age of cases for this reporting period has increased from 40 to 43, with the highest number of cases for this week reported in the 31-40 age group. All Huron County zip codes reported cases this week with the highest infection rate in the New London (44851) zip code.

<u>Please Note</u>: Case counts included in this report are estimates for the reporting period based on reports generated from the Ohio Department of Health (ODH)'s Ohio Disease Reporting System (ODRS). These data may be impacted by several factors, including but not limited to:

- Lack of reporting individual cases (for example, if a self-administered at-home test kit results
 positive but individual case information is not reported to HCPH or recorded in the ODRS, this case
 will not be counted by ODH or included in this report); and
- Reporting delays with the electronic reporting of cases, especially during surge periods.


Other notable updates this week include:


U.S. Overview

This database provides an integrated, county view of key data for monitoring COVID-19 throughout the U.S. in a standardized format with various colors indicating levels of community transmission. The two sets of images below demonstrate the change from 1/26/2022-2/5/2022. As of 2/5/2022, Huron County remains at a high level of transmission. With high transmission, CDC is recommending even individuals who are fully vaccinated to wear a mask in public indoor settings.




Cumulative Data






Current Week Data

For the reporting period of 1/28/2022-2/03/2022, there were **172 new cases** reported. The graphs below indicate positive COVID-19 cases in Huron County for the reporting period of 1/28/2022-2/03/2022, shown by age group and by zip code (by both case counts and incidence rate).

Huron County currently ranks 72nd among all Ohio counties for two-week incidence rate for the current reporting period. Last week, Huron County ranked 71st.



Primary COVID-19 Vaccinations

Everyone 5 years and older is now eligible to get a COVID-19 vaccination. To learn more about COVID-19 vaccinations, visit: https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/vaccines/index.html.

Huron County Public Health (HCPH) currently has the Pfizer, Moderna and Janssen (Johnson & Johnson) vaccine available for appointments at HCPH's office in Norwalk for individuals aged 5+ interested in receiving the Pfizer vaccine, or Moderna and Janssen (Johnson & Johnson) vaccine for individuals age 18+.

Interested individuals can schedule a vaccination or booster appointment at HCPH by calling 419-668-1652 ext. 241. Please bring a valid ID and insurance information to your vaccination appointment. Individuals must be 5+ to receive the Pfizer vaccine, and 18+ to receive the Moderna or Johnson & Johnson vaccine. Individuals under the age of 18 must have a parent or legal guardian present with them at the appointment.

Booster Doses

Everyone ages 12 and older can get a booster shot. The chart below outlines current booster recommendations:

COVID-19 At Home Test Kit Update

Although HCPH does not have test kits available for public distribution at this time, kits may be accessed in the following ways:

- Each household nationwide is eligible to order four free at-home COVID-19 test kits at https://www.covidtests.gov/.
- Eligible communities can order additional free, rapid at-home COVID-19 test kits at https://www.accesscovidtests.org/.

- While testing supply chains are challenged, over-the-counter rapid testing kits can still be purchased at many locations, such as pharmacies and grocery stores. Private health insurance will reimburse the cost of purchasing self-tests up to a certain amount each month.
- Testing is also available at many urgent care locations, community health centers, retail locations, and popup sites. The ODH website features a searchable map of testing locations at https://coronavirus.ohio.gov/wps/portal/gov/covid-19/dashboards/other-resources/testing-ch-centers.
