Huron County Public Health COVID-19 Weekly Update

February 10, 2023

Report Summary

This report covers Huron County's COVID-19 update for the reporting period of 2/3/2023 – 2/9/2023. This reporting period has recorded a case count of 28 cases, an increase from 17 cases for the previous week's reporting period. For Huron County, the highest number of cases for this week was in the 51-60 age group. Eight zip codes in Huron County reported cases this week, with the highest infection rate in the Bellevue area (44811) zip code.

Important Notes About This Report

COVID-19 case counts included in this report are estimates for the reporting period based on reports generated from the Ohio Department of Health (ODH)'s Ohio Disease Reporting System (ODRS). These data may be impacted by several factors, including but not limited to:

- Lack of reporting individual cases (for example, if a self-administered at-home test kit results positive but individual case information is not reported to HCPH or recorded in the ODRS, this case will not be counted by ODH or included in this report); and
- Reporting delays with the electronic reporting of cases, especially during surge periods.

COVID-19 Wastewater Monitoring Network

Wastewater monitoring for COVID-19 is a real-time, leading indicator that provides trend information regarding what is occurring in a community. Wastewater monitoring data, along with the number of positive individuals that have been tested at medical facilities and hospitalization information, are data sources that can be used to help inform local communities about the level of COVID-19 in their communities.

U.S. Overview

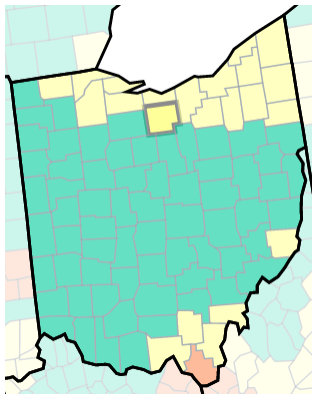
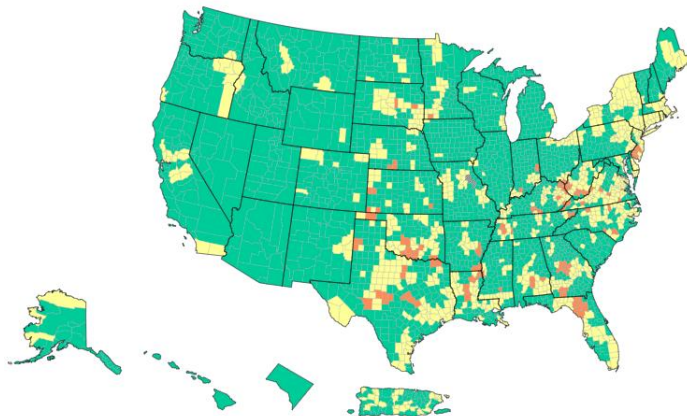

Community levels are determined by summarizing data of the following information: New COVID-19 cases per 100,000 population, new COVID-19 admissions per 100,000 population, and the percentage of inpatient beds occupied by COVID-19 patients. For the current reporting period, Huron County has been categorized as **low**. In communities with **low** levels of COVID-19, CDC recommends the following:

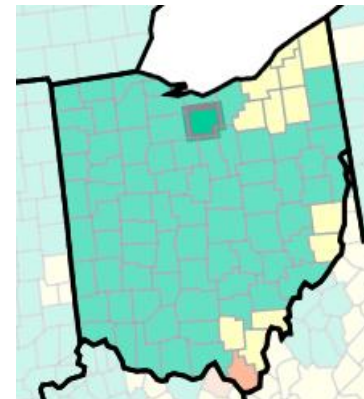
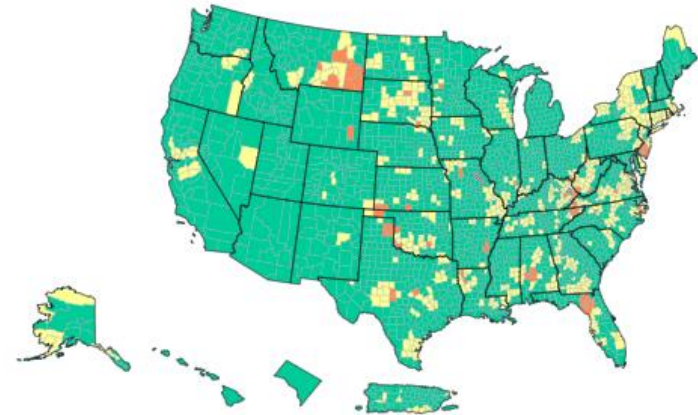
- Wear a mask on public transportation, and if you have symptoms, a positive test, or exposure to someone with COVID-19;

Previous Week: Medium (*as of 2/2/2023*)

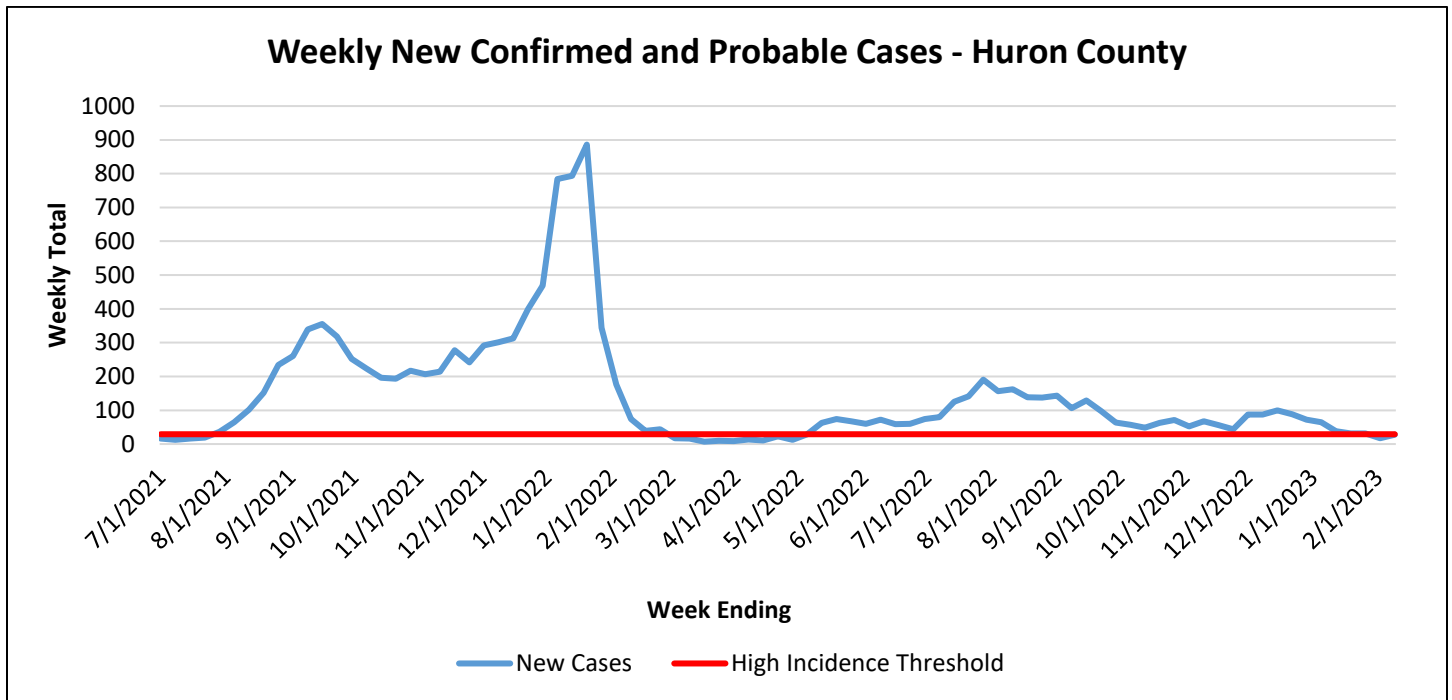


Current Week: Low (*as of 2/9/2023*)



Cumulative Data

Cumulative data for Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) cases in Huron County, Ohio as of Thursday, February 9, 2023 at 4:00pm. HCPH has reported a total of 17,844 cases to date.



Two Week Incidence Rate

Huron County currently remains 76th among all Ohio counties for two-week incidence rate for the current reporting period. The statewide average of cases per 100,000 residents over two weeks has slightly increased from 124.2 the previous reporting period to 130.2 for this reporting period.

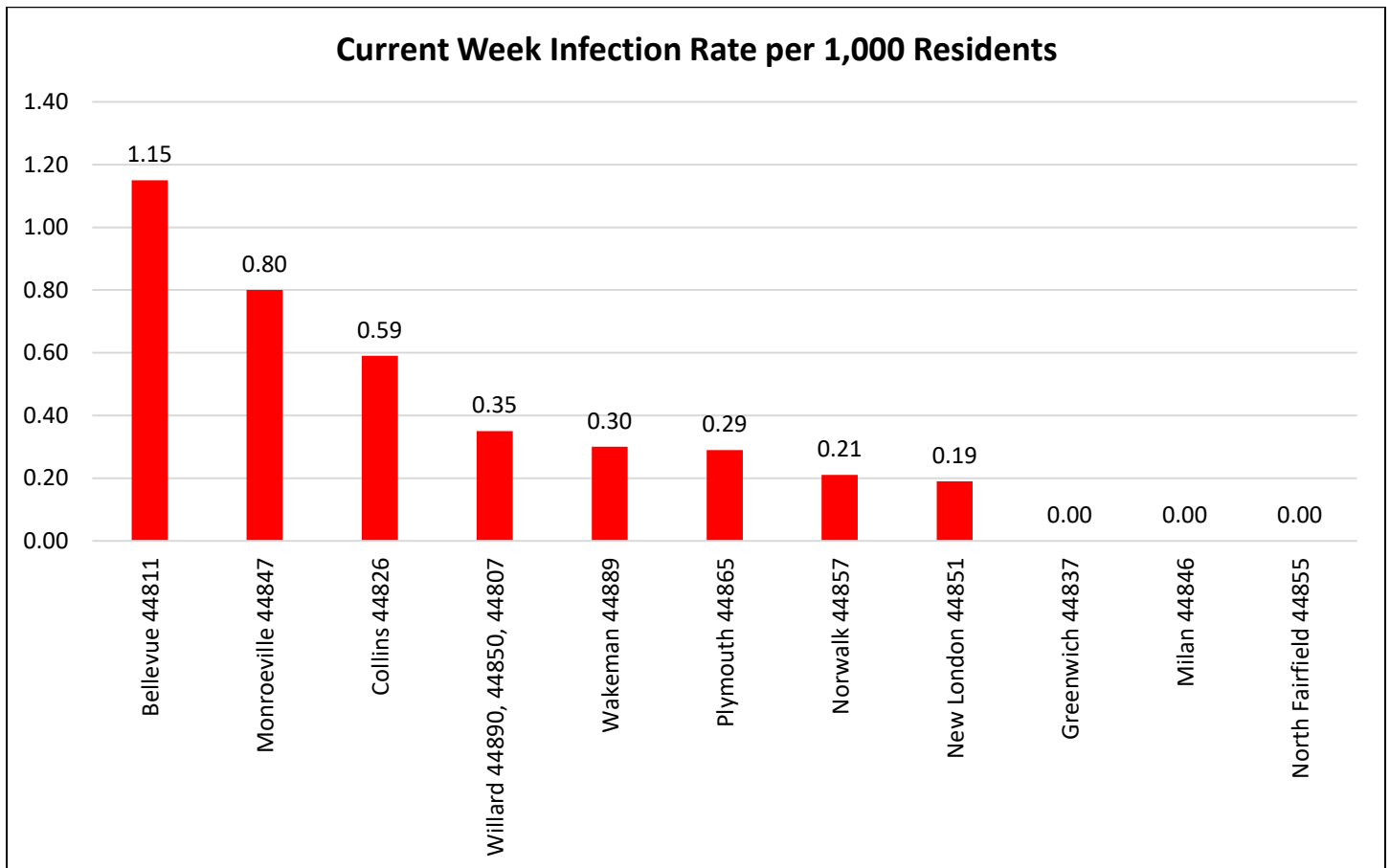
