## CHC INFORMATION

Huron County Public Health (HCPH) is one of 23 grantees of the Ohio Department of Health's Creating Healthy Communities Ġrant. This is a 5-year federal grant that counties can apply to receive up to \$100,000 per year. (2024-2029).

The \$100,000 per year includes personnel and nonpersonnel funding. A table showing average dispersed funding the last 4 years is attached at the

The current grant cycle is October 1, 2025-September 30, 2026.

All funded projects are expected to work in communities with a high Social Vulnerability Index (SVI) score and/or other demonstrated need. Applications may include a single county or multicounty project area, and the application should define the project area, such as county, city, township, census tract(s), census block group(s), or census block(s).

CHC projects should include Active Living and Healthy Eating strategies for chosen communities.

ODH provides a strategy guide to follow with what CHC funds can be used per project.

Based on 2020-2024 averages- percentages may vary depending on grant year and ODH allocated amount rewarded. This will include rising general inflation as well.
